Pope Francis Joins Faith Leaders in Calling for World Day of Prayer to End the Coronavirus

Pope Francis calls on believers of all religions to pray together today, May 14, to ask God to rid the world of the pandemic and asks that the vaccines be made available to all persons threatened with infection.

At the start of Mass in the Casa Santa Marta today, Pope Francis encouraged people of all faiths to pray, fast, and perform works of charity. None of us expected the coronavirus pandemic, he said. Now it is upon us, and "many people are dying, many of them alone."

The Pope warned those who have not been touched by the pandemic not to rejoice. "Often the thought can arise: Well, at least I haven't been affected. Thank God, I'm safe.' But think about others. Think about the tragedy and its consequences on the economy and education. Think about what will come afterwards." He said we unite in prayer today to overcome this selfish attitude.

He also encouraged international cooperation to respond to the crisis, and emphasized the importance that scientific efforts to find a vaccine be put together in "transparent and disinterested way" and that "the essential technologies be made universally available" so that every infected

person may be able to receive the medical care needed.

The Pope's appeal calls on "all peoples around to the world to do good deeds, observe fast, pray and make devout supplications to God Almighty to end this pandemic." It continues that "each one from wherever they are and according to the teachings of their religion, faith, sect, should implore God to lift this pandemic off the entire world, to rescue us from this adversity, to inspire scientists to find a cure that can turn back this disease, and to save the whole

world from the health, economic and human repercussions of this serious pandemic."

The High Committee for Human Fraternity "invites all religious leaders and peoples around the world to respond to this call for humanity and together beseech God Almighty to safeguard the entire world, to overcome this pandemic, to restore security, stability, healthiness, and prosperity, so that after this pandemic is over, our world will become a better place for humanity and fraternity than ever before." Giving Tuesday Assists Immigrant Children with e-Learning



The National Shrine of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini joined the Cabrini Retreat Center on Tuesday, May 5th for GivingTuesdayNow, a day of Global Action for giving and unity in response to COVID-19. It was the decision of Sister Bridget Zanin, MSC, Director of the National Shrine, to explore the needs of immigrants in our local community in Chicago. Nancy Golen, Director at the Cabrini Retreat Center, located in Des Plaines, IL, put [the Shrine staff] in contact with Exodus World Service, a Christian organization that empowers people to be champions for refugees.

Exodus World Service discussed with the Shrine staff the need for

Chromebooks. During this pandemic, immigrant children in Chicago are falling increasingly behind

in their education. They don't have access to computers for e-learning, so, we dedicated this Global Day of Giving to raise a minimum of \$1000.00 for the purchase of four Chromebooks for four immigrant families.

Mother Cabrini based her work on the "education of the heart." As a teacher, her aim was always the formation of the whole person as it instills a special concern for those in need. We asked each of our communities if they would help us "educate the hearts" of immigrant children and we were delighted in their response as we were able to provide Exodus World Service with the funds to purchase five Chromebooks for five immigrant families.

National Religious Vocations Conference releases 2020 Study

At the end of a decade of steady entrances to religious communities, the NRVC has released its 2020 Study of Recent Vocations to Religious Life. This latest research provides information on those men and women who entered religious life from 2013 – 2018. We began our coverage in last week's edition. This week we explore some further topics of the study.

Intergenerational Living

While age presents challenges for communities when inviting young people to join, it has not deterred those who entered from doing so. Thirteen percent of perpetually professed are younger than 60, and the identical proportion are aged 90 or older.

In ranking their attitudes about various aspects of communal life, new members give their religious institutes the highest ratings on their care and support of the elderly members. Most newer members prefer to live in communities with members of different ages (93 percent).

It was the 80 year-old [sisters], the wisdom figures of the community [who] were always the first in the chapel and the last at the dining room table. They were always there, you could always count [on their presence].



The vitality of the MSC Institute is the diversity of cultures and intergenerational community.

Prayer and Spirituality

Personal private prayer characterizes the regular prayer life of the majority of sisters, brothers and priests in almost all responding institutes. Daily Eucharist and Liturgy of the Hours are almost as common, reported by nearly nine in ten responding institutes.

As I was growing in my prayer life, I realized that I really wanted my whole life to be that intimate communion with God. And the more that desire grew, the more I saw the way it's lived out in religious life.

Education

The majority (95 percent) of perpetually professed religious have a college degree. The majority of newer members come with considerable education as well as ministry and work experience. Seventy-one percent of new members had at least a bachelor's degree before they entered. Eight in ten were employed, usually in a full-time position, and slightly more than half were in engaged in ministry, a quarter on a full-time basis and about three fifths on a volunteer basis.
