Pope Francis Sends Greetings to President Biden

In a message of "cordial good wishes" to President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. after his installation as the 46th president of the United States, Pope Francis assured him of his prayers that "Almighty God will grant you wisdom and strength in the exercise of your high office."

He told the president that he prayed that "under your leadership, may the American people continue to draw strength from the lofty political, ethical and religious values that have inspired the nation since its founding."

"At a time when the grave crisis facing our human family calls for farsighted and united responses," Pope Francis wrote, "I pray that your decisions will be guided by a concern for building a society marked by authentic justice and freedom, together with unfailing respect for the rights and dignity of every person, especially the poor, the vulnerable and those who have no voice."

Furthermore, the Pope said, "I ask God, the source of all wisdom and truth, to guide your efforts to foster understanding, reconciliation and peace within the United States and among the nations of the world in order to advance the universal common good."

Pope Francis concluded by invoking God's blessing on the president, his family and "the beloved American people."

WASHINGTON (CNS) — Hours before his inauguration as president, Joe Biden and incoming Vice President Kamala Harris were joined by their spouses and congressional leaders from both political parties for what was termed a Mass of Thanksgiving early January 20 at St. Matthew Cathedral in Washington.

Among those invited to the Mass were House Majority Leader Nancy Pelosi, D-California, a Catholic, House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy, R-California, new Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-New York, and Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Kentucky.

Sen. Amy Klobuchar, D-Minnesota, tweeted, "Such an honor to be able to attend the inaugural church service this morning at the Cathedral of Saint Matthew. It is aptly called the 'Mass of Thanksgiving.'"

Jesuit Father Kevin O'Brien, president of Jesuit-run Santa Clara University in California, was the scheduled celebrant.

It was important to Biden that a bipartisan group of congressional leaders join him as "the beginning of a path forward" to national healing and political unity at the outset of his term.

Biden Administration Sets New Immigration Policies in Motion

Acting Homeland Security Secretary David Pekoske issued a memo hours after President Biden's inaugural Wednesday setting strict limits for arresting and deporting immigrants while the department reviews its policies and practices. He also imposed an "immediate" 100-day pause on the deportations of certain noncitizens, to take effect no later than Friday. Pekoske is in charge as the Senate considers the nomination of <u>Alejandro Mayorkas</u>, the former deputy DHS secretary during the Obama administration.

The <u>memo</u> is the first step in a broader plan to find a different solution for the 11 million undocumented immigrants in the United States, many of whom have lived here for years and have U.S.-citizen children. Many are essential workers — delivery workers, caregivers, even physicians — but Congress has not passed a major citizenship bill since 1986.

Biden has <u>unveiled</u> legislation that would allow millions to apply for citizenship, following in the footsteps of former presidents <u>George W. Bush</u> (R) and Barack Obama (D), who attended his inauguration Wednesday, and also advocated, albeit unsuccessfully, for immigration reform.

In the memo, Pekoske ordered DHS' chief of staff to review the agency's immigration policies over the next 100 days and recommend revisions.



DHS also suspended the Migrant Protection Protocols on Wednesday, ordering that no new migrants are to be added to the program, which requires Mexico to host asylum seekers as they await their hearings in the United States. But Covid-related travel restrictions remain in place, so asylum seekers are unable to immediately enter the United States, officials said Wednesday.

"All current MPP participants should remain where they are, pending further official information from U.S. government officials," DHS said in a statement. But the Pekoske memo signaled that the new administration is focused on expanding asylum processing at the southwest border, which has been paralyzed during the pandemic.

DHS intends to "fairly and efficiently" process asylum claims while adhering to health protocols to prevent the spread of Covid-19, the memo said.

Biden is expected to announce additional immigration actions on Jan. 29.


As the nation reels from a January 6 insurrection at the Capitol and impeachment in Congress, sisters said the new administration, led by President Joe Biden, will be a relief.

Monday, January 11, 2021 was a very exciting day at Cabrini of Westchester because residents and staff received the second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine! A team from CVS Pharmacy was on site to administer both doses of the Pfizer BioNTech vaccine, the first of which was distributed on December 21, 2020. In total, 217

residents and 177 staff members opted to be inoculated. Another site visit is planned for February 1, 2021.

"We are fortunate that the Covid-19 vaccine has demonstrated-safety and is highly effective," said Dr. Jeffrey Gold, Cabrini of Westchester's Medical Director. "Receiving the COVID-19 vaccine is

the most effective way that we can protect ourselves, and most especially the residents, in order to address the global pandemic."

With the second dose, the vaccine is said to be more than 90% effective against the on-going threat of the COVID-19 virus. This is a great relief to the residents, staff and most especially the family members, who haven't seen their loved ones in person in quite a long time. "A renewed sense of hope accompanies the availability of the vaccine for the residents and our hard-working staff," said Patricia Krasnausky, President and CEO. 

January 2021 is National *Anti*-Human Trafficking Awareness Month

January 2021 is National Anti-Human Trafficking Awareness Month. It is a key time for all of us, as



individuals, to educate ourselves about human trafficking and to learn to spot the signs of trafficking. It is also a time for us to take these messages to our workplaces, our churches, our schools, our families and our friends.

The Director of the National Human Trafficking Hotline # says the first months of COVID-related shutdowns brought a 40-percent increase in crisis calls, while requests for shelter nearly doubled. Traffickers prey upon people experiencing heightened vulnerabilities linked to pandemic-related lock downs, stay at home orders, and job loss. **Knowing how to 'spot the signs' could save lives.**

Someone you know may be in a sex trafficking situation if:

- They want to stop participating in selling or trading sex but feel scared or unable to leave.
- They disclose that they were reluctant to engage in selling sex but that someone pressured them into it.
- They live where they work or are transported by guards between home and workplace.
- They are children who live with or are supported by or dependent on a family member with a substance abuse problem or who is abusive in other ways.
- They have a manager in the sex trade.
- They have visual signs of abuse.
- They work in an industry where it may be common to be pressured into performing sex acts for money, such as a strip club, illicit cantina, go-go bar, or illicit massage business.
- They have an older, or simply controlling parent, guardian, romantic partner or "sponsor" who will not allow you to meet or speak with the person alone or monitors their movements, spending and/or communications. ~ Polaris Project. ~ submitted by Karol Brewer, CAAC
