## Accompanying Migrants at the Border Enriches Our Spiritual Lives

Fr. Tom Greene, the head of the Jesuits' U.S. Central and Southern province, has come to Sacred Heart as his last stop on a yearlong Ignatian pilgrimage to visit parishes across his territory.

Greene is clearly humbled as he considers the impact of his past work as an attorney handling asylum cases in Chicago, practicing immigration law with unaccompanied minors and offering legal counseling at detention centers.

Whenever I've questioned anyone who's accompanied migrants and asylum seekers about the impact, they turn pensive, sometimes, emotional, as they consider their experiences and attempt to find words.

"It was deeply spiritual and evangelical work," he finally says, "but I have to say that I was the one being evangelized much of the time."

Steeped in the Ignatian spirituality of finding God in all things, Greene acknowledges that migrant youth taught him what it means to profess one's faith by how they saw God in their perilous and uncertain journeys. Their immense faith and hope made him question how he could not have hope in his own life, no matter the circumstances.

"The ultimate goal in the Christian life is to see the world from the eyes of Christ, and to have his response," Greene said. "So, to see these people beaten, abandoned, raped, extorted, called criminals, how could you not try and help them?"

Yet, Greene says that he was drawn to this ministry because it has helped him so much in his faith. "I was trying to be Christ for them and yet they were Christ for me" he says, acknowledging that may sound selfish.

I smile in recognition. I've heard this so many times, from so many volunteers, I know it's not a glib comment. From migrant shelters, to courtrooms, from the El Paso airport to the detention center, local volunteers have walked alongside and understood firsthand how Christ is present in the face of the migrant and refugee. ## Ukraine – a Hunting Ground for Traffickers

This week, we continue to explore more aspects of the human trafficking that is taking place in Ukraine.

#### **Exploiting the turmoil**



La Strada International, a consortium of dozens of advocacy groups, research, conducted over the past two months, found that unaccompanied children, undocumented people and those who might not have access to the temporary protection offered in European Union countries face the greatest danger.

"And the dangers will grow as the war continues, with more people becoming displaced within Ukraine, making access to services and

livelihoods increasingly precarious, while millions of refugees will need to settle for longer periods in other European countries and start accessing the labor market," the La Strada report said.

#### Pope praises work of Santa Marta Group to combat human trafficking

(The Santa Marta Group is an alliance of international police chiefs and bishops from around the world working together with civil society in a process endorsed by Pope Francis who called it "an open wound on the body of contemporary society", to eradicate human trafficking and modern day slavery. The Group is led by His Excellency Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster.)

Nearly 30 mothers and children were rescued after a bus intending to traffic them was stopped when a mother called a number she received from an anti-trafficking leaflet. Cardinal Vincent Nichols shared this as an example of a best practice implemented to combat the scourge of anti-trafficking as part of the efforts of the Santa Marta Group.

Nichols recalled very informative and inspiring reports from the police forces of Poland and Lithuania. "It is just an enormous challenge," he noted, stressing the war in Ukraine has caused the largest movement of people in a short time across borders in Europe for 60 or 70 years.

"A positive" aspect which the Cardinal shared was "that because of some of the partnerships that have already been established, within a matter of hours, leaflets had been prepared warning those who were crossing the border against the dangers of being



trafficked." Those leaflets, he noted, had a contact number, and one of them was passed out to a Ukrainian woman who then narrowly avoided falling into the hands of human traffickers.



"She was encouraged onto a bus and there was a busload of women with some children, and she realized they were not going in the direction that she expected. So, she had a mobile phone. She rang the number, the police came and stopped the bus, and I believe some 27 women and children were rescued from potential forced labor or slavery."


This, he said, is a specific example of the many "stories of speedy action attributed to existing patterns of cooperation." The Cardinal warned that authorities are fighting an uphill battle.

"It was pointed out to him that, to begin with, the better-educated, probably better-off people, were those able to get to the border," he noted, explaining that "those coming now are the poorer people who have less resilience and fewer resources." 
