The General Chapter brings with it much deliberation, large and small group discussion, discernment, and hard work all centered in prayer. Sr. Diane Dalle Molle, MSC (I.) and Sr. Maureen Bennett, MSC, both of the Holy Spirit Region, talk through some of the forthcoming Chapter mandates and recommendations.

Last week, the Chapter focused on composing mandates and recommendations for Mission, Formation, Vocation and Governance for Mission. Throughout the Chapter the Sisters are seeking common paths for our journey, striving for greater synodality and interconnection between us: MSCs, laity, and the beneficiaries of the Cabrinian mission in the world.

On the birthday of Mother Cabrini, July 15th, she was

remembered at the Chapter with morning prayer, followed by a procession with candles, her statue, and a song dedicated to her into the Chapter Room.

Following the time of prayer, the Chapter Assembly focused on discussing and approving some of the Mandates, Recommendations and the Theological Reflection.

Later in the day, the Chapter delegates continued to celebrate Mother's birth and at Mass they asked Mother Cabrini to intercede for all, especially during the Chapter.

Texas Bishops Call for Immigration Reform following Migrant Tragedy ~ by Rhina Guidos, Catholic News Service

WASHINGTON (CNS) – The Texas Catholic bishops urged immigration reform, saying it is necessary to prevent what happened to 53 migrants discovered in a trailer on June 27 from happening again.

Reminding others to reflect on the incident, they focused on defending the sacredness of every life.

Cardinal DiNardo of Galveston-Houston recalled Pope Francis' lament, the "throwaway culture" the pope warns against, which leads humanity to discard God's creation, including people.

"This senseless loss of life should shock and sadden us as we are all brothers and sisters in Christ," said Cardinal Di Nardo, "We cannot ignore those most vulnerable among us who at times become victims of this throwaway culture and

only seek a better life for themselves and their families."

He commended the souls of the men and women who died near San Antonio after being smuggled into the U.S. in the part of a semitrailer reserved for cargo, not people. They were traveling without air-conditioning or ventilation in temperatures that surpassed 100 degrees. It was not clear how long they had been inside the trailer.

Authorities said the man identified as the truck driver, Homero Zamorano, Jr., fled the scene, leaving the migrants, which included minors, dead and dying. He has been apprehended and charged with alien smuggling resulting in death. Three others also have been arrested in connection with the incident."

"The exploitation of the poor and in particular of migrants who flee dramatic situations in search of opportunities and hope is particularly grave," said Archbishop Garcia-Siller of San Antonio.

Bishop Olson of Fort Worth said, "our nation's past unwillingness to address immigration...has brought us to a moment of polarization and crisis that threatens the vulnerable.

"The light of our faith should prompt us to care and to address the causes of these injustices as Christians, as Americans, and as men and women of goodwill," he added. To read the complete account, please click here

VATICAN: Although modern means of communication can be "a powerful means of fostering communion and dialogue within our human family," they can also become "places of toxicity, hate speech, and fake news," warns Pope Francis, in a message to the lay communications



network SIGNIS which is holding its annual World Congress in Seoul in August.

Pope Francis notes, "The use of digital media, especially social media, has raised a number of serious ethical issues that call for wise and discerning judgment on the part of all communicators, and all those concerned with authenticity and the quality of human relationships."



The Holy Father also calls attention to the importance of listening "as the first and indispensable ingredient of dialogue and good communication."

Listening, he says, is likewise essential to the synodal journey that the whole

Church has undertaken in these years. Communication...is a service to dialogue and understanding between individuals and larger communities in the pursuit of a serene and peaceful coexistence.

The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

July 24, 2022

Pope Francis has established throughout the Church the <u>celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly</u> on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. The announcement of this celebration coincided with the celebration of the Year of Amoris Laetitia Family, which began on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary, on March 19, 2021, and concluded at the World Meeting of Families in Rome in June of 2022.



The next World Day for Grandparents and Elderly is July 24, 2022. The theme for this year's celebration is "In Old Age They Will Still Bear Fruit" (Ps. 92:15). The theme is meant to emphasize how grandparents are a gift both to society and the Church. For more


