# Transforming *Stress* into Positive Outcomes

Cabrini Immigrant Services (CIS), Dobbs Ferry, held a workshop entitled, "Tu Arma Secreta: Convirtiendo el Estres en una Fuerza Positiva." ("Your Secret Weapon: Turning Stress into a Positive Force"). The workshop was presented by Betsy Suarez, a licensed mental health counselor.

Betsy spoke about how stress can lead to anxiety and how it can affect your mental health and other health issues. She explained how understanding and managing stress is essential to your well-being. Betsy shared how turning stress into a positive force can help you. She gave

many therapeutic strategies to help create a more positive relationship with stress. She showed how reframing negative thoughts, journaling, walking, etc. can all help create a more positive attitude. Betsy stated that a positive outlook can transform stress from an obstacle into an opportunity.

It is no secret that everyone is dealing with elevated levels of stress. This workshop left everyone feeling empowered and ready to try the new strategies that they learned.

# The 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque

Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart devotion to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in several mystical visions between 1673 and 1675. To commemorate the **350th anniversary** of the Apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St Margaret Mary in Paray-le-Monial, a Jubilee lasting a year and a half has taken place from **December 27th 2023**, the anniversary of the first main apparition, to **June 27th 2025**, the date of the Solemnity of the Feast of the Sacred Heart and the 350th anniversary of the final apparition.

Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and revealed the mysteries of His Sacred Heart, saying, "Behold the heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love; and in return, I receive from most men the most grievous ingratitude." This apparition deepened St. Margaret Mary's understanding of Jesus' love and compassion, and it paved the way for the widespread devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the Catholic Church. It is through the four apparitions from 1673 to 1675 to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque that the message of the Sacred Heart was brought to the world.

Reproductions of an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome have been circulating the globe through the efforts of the Knights of Columbus during the past year and half.

The Church of St. Gregory the Great in Hamilton Square, NJ is honored to have one of the icons of the Sacred Heart this coming Friday and will be celebrating a Holy Hour to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
