The Cabrini High School community came together on Saturday, May 17, to honor the Class of 2025—53 extraordinary young women who collectively earned \$13.5 million in scholarships; the average scholarship amount per graduate is \$350,000. We've learned that this is, to date, the highest scholarship average among all girls' high schools in the city of New Orleans.
